Geography based, topic and we will be extending our knowledge and understanding beyond the United Kingdom to include Europe. Children will locate countries by using their knowledge of longitude and latitude, identifying the location of physical features of an environment. We will by linking our knowledge of Volcanoes by looking at two countries that are famous for these natural wonders- Italy and Iceland.

Science

Children will be deepening their existing knowledge of animals, including humans by investigating nutrition. They will conduct experiments to identify what is in the food eaten by humans. Children will learn how to apply scientific vocabulary to prove their hypothesis while making careful observations over time to draw conclusions which they will evaluate.
