

Year 1 Curriculum news Spring term



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We hope you had a lovely break and enjoyed some well deserved time off. Our topic is 'Paddington meets Royalty!' and we have got lots of things to look forward to. We will be learning about the history of toys over time, and there will be a toy shop in our classrooms with a range of different toys for the children to play with. If at anytime you need to speak to us, we will be available in the playground after school or you can use our emails as listed above.

PE Days:

Please ensure your child comes to school dressed for outdoor PE on the correct day—Thursday and Friday. Please make sure they are wearing the correct PE kit (white t-shirt, school jumper and black trousers / shorts.

Reading at home:

We expect all of the children to read for 10 minutes every day at home. Please write a comment or date and sign their reading diary to let us know that they have read. Your child will be given a reading book on a Monday for the week. They must remember to bring it to school every day. We will collect all books in on a Friday morning and will issue a new book every Monday.

Phonics

In June the children will all be taking a Phonics Screening Check. This check is a pass or not-pass, and checks their phonic ability to decode and blend to read words. Please continue to practice your child's phonics at home, using the assessment sheet that was sent home, and will be updated regularly throughout the terms.

Homework

This term we will be focusing on children reading at home as much as possible. The expectation is that the children read their books every evening. They will continue having weekly Maths homework on a Friday. They will also be bringing home a copy of our Talk for Writing story map so they can continue to practise our new story at home.

Reminders

Please ensure your child has appropriate clothing for the school day. They should come to school each day with a waterproof coat. In Year 1 we have our own outdoor area, therefore the children will be outdoors in all weathers.

The children should not be bringing in belongings, such as toys and pencil cases, from home as we cannot be responsible for these. Thank you.

Literacy

Key Texts: Isadora Moon goes to

School.

Purpose for writing: Instructions.

Writing: Children will be learning how to write Instructions using the model

text: How to make a marmalade sandwich.

Shared reading: We will then be learning how to make simple predictions based on a text and learn the meaning of new vocabulary using the book: 'Once upon a wish'.

Phonics: This term we will continue teaching Phase 5, the children will be learning new sounds. Please continue to practice the phonics sounds that we have previously sent home.

History

Focus: Toys In History this term, we are learning about Toys and their changes within living memory. We will be asking for children to come into school with their favourite toy, in a named bag. We may even ask for parents or grandparents to share with us what toys they used to play with when they were little! The children will be learning chronological skills and will learn to use phrases to show the passing of time. This links to children's learning in Reception, where they have explored using the language 'long, long ago'.

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Focus: Structures

The children will be making a London Monument to fit with our topic of Paddington Meets Royalty. The children will be working with paper and card to make simple flaps and hinges. They will learn the skills of shaping and joining using simple equipment.

PSHE & Relationships education Focus: Keeping myself safe

Children will develop a good understanding of how our feelings can keep us safe and healthy including medicine safety.

Number: In Maths, the focus for the first half-term will be

on Number and Place value within 20, the children will order and compare groups of objects and numbers. The children will build on their knowledge of numbers to 10, and really understand numbers 11-20.

Addition and Subtraction within 20: The children will be

focusing on adding and taking away within 20 using resources and instant recall of number bonds within 10.

Science

Focus: Biology—Trees and Seasonal Change

The children will be able to Identify and name a variety of common wild and garden plants including deciduous and evergreen trees. They will know ten British (local) trees by shape, leaf, flower, and seed. They will know that deciduous trees shed their leaves in Autumn and evergreen trees keep their leaves all year. This draws links to their previous learning, where they have studied seasonal change and growing in Reception.
