

Welcome to Year 1

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This term we will be learning about Mary Anning and the significant part she played in the discovery of fossils. The children will also be learning about the different animal groups in Science, as our classroom environment turns into "In the Jungle!". Later on in the term, the children will be making a fruit kebab, ready for a picnic in the Jungle. Thursday & Friday

Reading at home:

We expect all of the children to read for 10 minutes every day at home. Please write a comment or date and sign their reading diary to let us know that they have read. Your child will be given a reading book on a Monday for the week. They must remember to bring it to school every day. We will collect all books in on a Friday morning and will issue a new book every Monday.

Phonics

In June the children will all be taking a Phonics Screening Check.
This check is a pass or fail, and checks their Phonic ability to decode and blend to read words.
Please continue to practice your child's phonics at home, using the assessment sheet that was sent home, and will be updated regularly throughout the terms.

Homework

This term we will be focusing on children reading at home as much as possible. The expectation is that the children read their books every evening. They will continue having weekly Maths homework on a Friday. They will also be bringing home a copy of our Talk for Writing story map to practice the new text at home.

Reminders & Considerations

Please ensure your child has appropriate clothing for the school day. They should come to school each day with a waterproof coat. In Year 1 we have our own outdoor area, therefore the children will be outdoors in all weathers.

Literacy

Key Texts: Mango, Bam Bang, Narwhal The Unicorn of the Sea

Purpose for writing: Information text– Report

Writing: The children will be writing an information text, a report on an imaginary sea creature.

Word Reading / Comprehension: Children will focus on how we can infer from the text and how we can make predictions based on the information we have gained from the text. Alongside this, we will continue to develop vocabulary and understand why an author chooses to use certain words.

Phonics: We will be revisiting Phase 5 phonics, to help prepare them for the phonics screening check in June.

History

Children will be learning about a significant individual: Mary Anning, and the key role she played in discovering fossils. Children will be using the language, a long time ago, before I was born. They will look at a range of sources of information. This draws on links from Reception, where the children talk about events in the past.

DT

Focus: Food— Prepare fruit and vegetables for a picnic in the Jungle.

They will use cutting, peeling and slicing skills to make their own fruit kebabs.

Key Facts: Recall counting in 10's to 100. Doubles and halves to 20. Recall number bonds to 20.

Multiplication and division: The children will begin to count in 2's, 5's and 10's. They will make equal groups, find doubles, make arrays and sharing. They will use repeated addition.

Number: In Fractions, the children will learn how to find a half and a quarter of shapes and quantities.

Geometry: Position and direction— The children will be learning how to make quarter, half and 3 quarter turns, and will be using the beebots to direct them from one place to another.

Science

Focus: Biology– Animals

The children will be able to identify the different animal groups, and name and identify a variety of common animals such as: birds, fish, amphibians, reptiles and mammals. This draws on links from Reception, where the children learn about minibeast and animals that grow and change.
