



What is the Sports Premium?

In March 2013 the Government announced a major new funding initiative to support the delivery of Physical Education (PE) and sport in primary schools.

This cross-government funding is provided by the Department for Education, with contributions from the Department of Health and the Department of Culture, Media and Sport. The PE and sport premium will provide over £150 million per year for the academic years 2013/14 through to 2015/16.

The PE and sport premium is paid directly to primary schools and can only be spent on improving the quality of PE and sport provision for all pupils.

Schools with 17 or more eligible pupils receive £16,000 plus £10 per eligible pupil.

St Andrews received **£18,360** for the academic year 2017/18. Please see the table below for details on how we're planning to spend our allocation. The impact on children will be added towards the end of the academic year.
