This term there will be a History focus to our learning and we will be discovering the amazing facts about the Ancient Egyptian civilization. The children will learn about how ordinary people lived alongside the rich Kings and Pharaohs. They will gain an understanding of chronological order by placing the Ancient Egyptian civilization on a time-line. The children will gain an understanding of the importance of religion in Ancient Egyptian times and learn about the main Gods and Goddesses along with the rituals of mummification and burials.

Trips and Visitors:


Visit to Leicester Museum to explore the exhibits and take part in a workshop about Egyptian Mummies.
