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We hope you had a lovely break during the half term. We thank you for your continued support. This half term, we will be providing lots of opportunity for team work, learning about our rights and responsibilities to keep ourselves safe and learning about our Curriculum Question through our topic . We are continuing with a Geography based, topic and we will be extending our knowledge and understanding beyond the United Kingdom to include Europe. Children will locate countries by using their knowledge of longitude and latitude, identifying the location of physical features of an environment. We will embed our learning and understanding of volcanoes and link this to Human geography, studying the people who have settled in close proximity to volcanoes.

Homework

Reading - all children are expected to read at home **every day**.

Maths — children will be given weekly maths homework which will be a continuation of work they are completing in class that week alongside weekly times tables practice on TT Rock-stars.

Spellings

All children will be sent home a personalised spelling list to practise their spellings. This is an optional activity for the children as they will be taught statutory spellings each week in class and be given the opportunity to show off what they know in a dictation lesson.



English

Reading Key Text: Peter Pan by J.M. Barry

Poetry Focus: Louder than a clap of Thunder– Jack Prelutsky

Purpose for Writing: To entertain with a focus on action.

Writing: The children will be using the story of Peter Pan to create their own 'Beat the Monster' stories and focusing on what makes an action packed narrative. We will also be studying poetry based on the reading in class.

Grammar: We always respond to the grammar needs of our class from our assessments and will be teaching specifically about punctuation use, time conjunctions, dramatic dialogue and character's feelings.

Word Reading / Comprehension: The children will be taught a range of strategies of how to work out the meaning of unknown words. The children will also be working on the skills of prediction and inference, background knowledge.

Geography

The children will learn all about the how volcanoes and earthquakes happen and why they happen in the places they do. They will use map skills to find the location of volcanoes and the tectonic plate fault lines. The children will use a variety of skills to create a volcano and make it erupt as part of their learning journey. In preparation for the summer term topic of The Romans, children will be looking at volcanoes in Europe with a special focus on Italy.

ART

Focus: Materials– Dying and colouring fabrics.

This term we will be learning about a variety of different ways to change the colour of fabrics. The children will be working towards tie-dying materials.

Relationships Health Education & PSHE

Focus: Rights and Responsibilities

Children know how they can make a difference (different ways of helping others or the environment) and develop an understanding of the way in which media can influence decisions including spending money.

Science

Chemistry: Rocks and Soils

We will be learning how to compare, group and organize rocks based upon their appearance and simple physical characteristics. We will be studying how fossils are formed and that soils are made from rocks. This will build on our knowledge from Year 1 and Year 2 from materials and material suitability.

Working Scientifically:

We will be learning about asking relevant questions, making observations and carrying out fair test. We will also learn to classify data and record and report findings from an enquiry.
