#### Literacy

Key Text: The Explorer by Katherine Rundell

Purpose for Writing: Newspaper style recounts and Persuasion.

**Writing:** Children will learn how to compose a persuasion text with links throughout the curriculum, especially maths where children will need to prove their ideas and theories. Don't be surprised if your children come home with a few extra tricks to convince you they need more pocket money! We will be facing our phobias when writing out fear stories, really focusing on making the feelings of our characters come alive with lots of description.

**Grammar:** Each teacher will be reactive to the children's needs, using the Cold Write. However, these units lend themselves to the teaching of different sentence types, descriptive writing and using a range of punctuation.

**Word Reading / Comprehension:** Children will learn to sequence and summarise a text, use retrieval skills and explain and discuss their understanding of books, poems and other material.

## Geography

Focus: The Amazon is the second longest river, the larges in terms of how much water travels down it each year and the lifeblood of the largest rainforest in the world. The children will learn how with natural wonder benefits our whole planet, and how it is under threat from human activity. They will learn about life on the river, and why is isn't the best place to grown crops. With obvious links to our science curriculum, we will learn how the wildlife has adapted and evolved to cope with the hot, humid environment. This build on Lower Key Stage 2 learning of climate and map skills.

#### ART

**Focus:** Drawing and Painting – Perspective:

Children will look at how artists like David Hockey, Georgia O'Keefe and Canaletto use techniques to give their landscapes depth and perspective on a flat page. This skill has lots of practical uses in a number of professions, and the children will practice and have lots of opportunity to make mistakes and improve during the half term.

## **PSHE & Relationships education**

Focus: Keeping Myself Safe

Children will continue to develop an understanding of how to manage risk, including staying safe online and the norms around the use of legal drugs (tobacco, alcohol).

## Computing

**Digital Composing:** For the first time ever, our children will be using SonicPi to compose music digitally using computer code.

Online safety: What are the rules for social media in the UK? (Link to PSHE)

#### PE

**Focus:** Pupils learn different styles of dance. Dance as a whole, pupils think about how to use movement to explore and communicate ideas and issues, and their own feelings and thoughts.

#### Music

Focus: The Blues and music influenced by the Amazon.

#### Maths

**Key Facts Y5**: Apply recall of times tables to decimals, e.g. 2X2=4, 0.2X2=0.4.

Multiply and divide whole numbers and decimals by 10, 100 and 1000 **Key Facts Y6:** Apply recall of times tables when both numbers are decimals e.g. 2X2=4, 0.2X0.2=0.04.

Fractions, Decimals and Percentages.: The children will build on their fractions knowledge from Lower Key Stage 2, and delve deeper into the connections between fractions, decimals and percentages.

**Units of measure.** Children will be build on their lower Key Stage 2 understanding of measurement by recapping converting metric units of length and linking them to metric units of volume and weight. Year 6s will also learn about imperial units of measure and their approximate metric equivalents.

#### Science

Focus: Classification of Plants

The pupils will be learning to organise information and separate living things based upon their close observations of the features of plants and micro-organisms. They will conduct experiments to identify how micro-organisms and plants develop. They will use microscopes to identify minute similarities and differences between them. Children will apply their mathematical skills of recording information to prove their observations and display their findings.

### Spanish

Focus: Shapes., building on our first term of fruits and vegetables.

#### RE

**Focus:** Creation and science: conflicting or complimentary?

During this unit, we will weigh up how far the Genesis 1 creation narrative is in conflict, or is complementary, with a scientific account.

We will explore whether reading Genesis as a poetic account conflicts with scientific accounts as well as discovering that many scientists throughout history, and now, are Christians. We will discuss how the discoveries of science make Christians wonder even more about the power and majesty of the Creator.
