Reading at home:

We will collect all books in on a Friday morning and will issue a new book every Monday.

Phonics

In June the children will all be taking a Phonics Screening Check. This check is a pass or fail, and checks their Phonic ability to decode and blend to read words. Please continue to practice your child's phonics at home, using the assessment sheet that was sent home, and will be updated regularly throughout the terms.

Homework

This term we will be focusing on children reading at home as much as possible. The expectation is that the children read their books every evening. They will continue having weekly Maths homework on a Friday. They will also be bringing home a copy of our Talk for Writing story map so they can continue to practice our new text at home.

Please ensure your child has appropriate clothing for the school day. They should come to school each day with a waterproof coat. Please ensure children do not bring toys or belongings from home.

Literacy

Key Texts: The Flamingo Hotel.



Purpose for writing: Cohesion

Writing: Children will be learning how to write cohesively using Rainbow Fish as a stimulus.

Shared reading: We will then be learning how to make simple predictions based on a text and learn the meaning of new vocabulary using the book: Meerkat Mail

Phonics: This term we will continue teaching Phase 5 phonics, the children will be learning new sounds. Please continue to practice the old and new phonics sounds that the children will be learning, in preparation for the Phonics Screening Check.

History

Focus: Toys in the past

The children will be learning about how toys have changed over time. We will use language of "now" and "then" and use historical skills of comparison. We will make judgements on times in the past based on the toys children played with. We will explore how toys work and the materials they are made from.

Art Focus: Andy Warhol

We will be exploring work in the style of Andy Warhol. The children will practice their own skills of Pop Art and then create a final piece (self-portrait) using these techniques.

PSHE & Relationships education Focus: Rights and Responsibilities

Children will learn how to take care of things including: Myself, my money and my environment.

Maths

Key Facts: Count to 20 then 50 and know 1 more/1 less of a given number. Doubles and halves to 10. Number bonds to 10. and 20

Number: In Maths we will be learning place value to 50, the children will count forwards and backwards within 50, represent numbers within 50 using tens and ones and compare groups of objects and numbers within 50.

Measurement: We will be learning about weight and volume, the children will use key vocabulary and use practical resources to measure and compare weight and volume.

Length and Height: We will be learning how to measure the length and height of objects using a ruler, and objects.

Science

Focus: Biology—Plants, flowers and seasonal change

The children will be able to identify and name a variety of common and wild garden plants.

Working Scientifically:

The children will be building on their observational skills and will learn to ask scientific questions. They will also be able to carry out a simple test and record their findings.
