As part of our focus on the value of **UNITY** this month we're supporting the Samaritans Purse charity and asking families to get involved with Operation Christmas Child! This is about sending a message of hope to children in need around the world through gift-filled shoe boxes. It is the world's largest children's Christmas project!

The shoe boxes are sent to children in hospitals, orphanage's, homeless shelters and poor communities. Often a shoe box full of gifts is the only present these children will receive at Christmas.

Our aim is for each family to make a shoe box that can be sent to disadvantage children. Every child who takes part will earn their **UNITY BADGE** for this month.

How to Pack your Shoe Box

- 1. Find an empty shoe box**
Wrap the lid and box separately
- 2. Decide if your gift is for a boy or a girl**
Decide if the boy/girl is 2-4 years, 5-9 years, or 10-14 years old
- 3. Special Item**
Select a toy, such as a doll, teddy, Yo-Yo, hygiene items or school supplies
- 4. Personalise and Pray**
Including a personalised note and/or photo makes a big impact and pray for the child who will receive your gift
- 5. Wrap the box in Christmas Wrapping Paper**
Clearly label the lid of the box with boy or girl and the age bracket

Your child will have come home with a leaflet explaining more.

We need to receive the shoe boxes in school by **Monday 14th November** so we can take them to Rockingham Road Baptist Church who are collecting the boxes on our behalf.
